Tunes such as *Tuxedo Junction*, *Satin Doll*, *Moonlight Serenade* and *In The Mood* helped folks cope with the difficult war years.

Musically the 40's was a time of a special brand of happy music known as swing. While commercial music has evolved through variations to rock and rap, the big bands of the swing era have never really disappeared.

The Annapolis Big Band is one such group carrying on the tradition of the swing era music.

The Annapolis Big Band plays authentic arrangements of well known swing era tunes. They have about 100 tunes in their library, including ballads, jive tunes and waltzes.

The band is comprised of 17 musicians playing arrangements written in the typical big band format of 5 saxophones, 4 trombones, 4 trumpets and a rhythm section of piano, guitar, bass and drums.

The band will play outside, under the stars, for your listening and dancing pleasure, Aug. 14th (rain date Aug 15th) in Paradise, at the Hankinson home (Ellenhurst), 10252 Highway 1, beginning at 7:30 p.m.

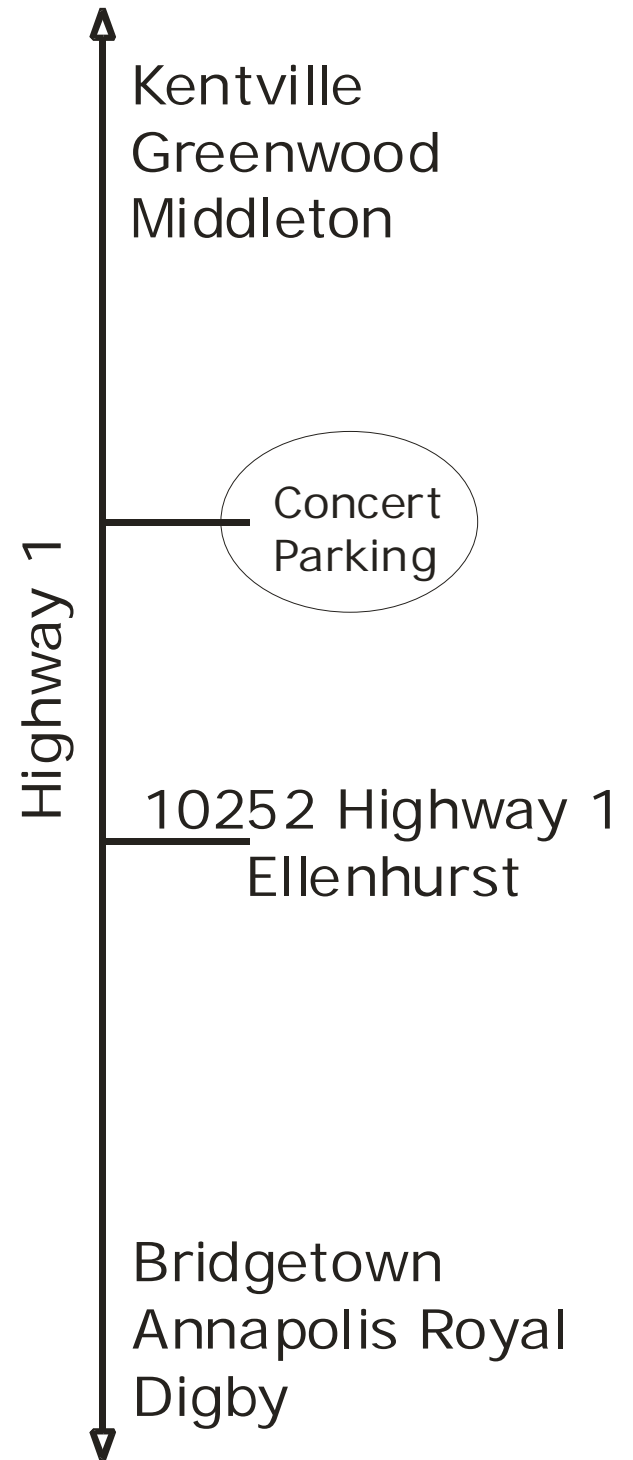
