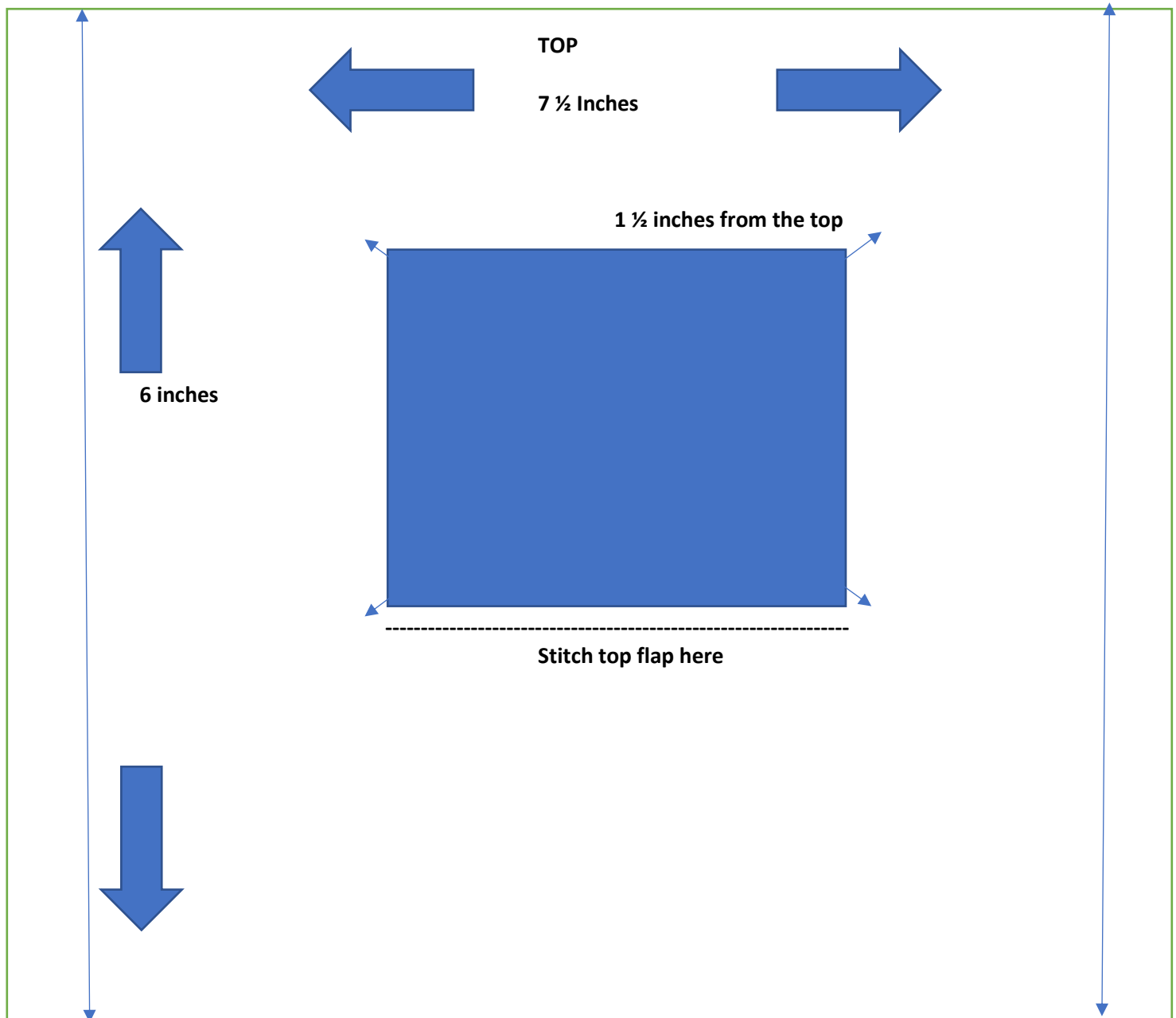


Flute Playing Mask Pattern

Inside (next to face) *not exactly as shown*



Inside Mask Template

Outside Rectangle 7 1/2 inches wide X 6 inches long (two pieces of fabric)

Inside opening is 1 1/2 inches below the top of the mask.

Inside Rectangle 3 inches wide X 2 1/2 inches long

Cover (Flap) 4" X 6" (two pieces of fabric)

Instructions (Inside)

1. Cut two pieces of fabric, using the mask template above.
2. Cut diagonally across the center rectangle to make the opening.
3. Fold triangles of fabric to the wrong side and iron in place.
4. With wrong sides together, sew the outer edges together, leaving openings (1/2 inch) at the top and bottom to thread ties through later.
5. Turn fabric right sides out.
6. Overstitch around the large opening, making sure all triangles are lying flat on the inside. (This will create the centre rectangle opening for your mouth.)

Outside Cover

1. Cut two pieces of fabric (4 inches X 6 inches) for the cover of the opening.
2. Stitch all around with wrong sides together, leaving a gap at the shorter end to turn right side out.
3. Iron flat (folding the edge of the gap inside)
4. Take the short end with the gap and place it on top, centered, just below the opening on the inside mask. Stitch in place.
5. Take the bottom of that same piece and lay it over the opening and top stitch it in place over the opening. There will be extra fabric to allow the flute to be placed inside.
6. Insert elastic or other material in the openings for the head ties.
